The question of salaries for 1960 was discussed at length and on motion by Commissioner Hollenbeck, seconded by Commissioner DenDooven, increases of approximately 3% were granted. All voting aye.

On motion by Commissioner DenDooven, seconded by Commissioner Hollenbeck to accept the proposal of Augar-Matic of Hutchinson, Minnesota to furnish all equipment and labor for cleaning sections of interceptor that might be obstructed at a cost of \$17.00 per hour. All voting aye.

On metion by Commissioner Hollenbeck, seconded by Commissioner Liebhauser the Superintendent was authorized to purchase a Verifax copying machine at a cost of \$148.00. All voting aye.

The Superintendent reported that 328.3 M.G. of sewage was treated during the month of April for an average of 10.94 M.G.D. The amount pumped was in excess of this figure being approximately 447.7 M.G.

A total of 6,497 pounds of chlorine was used to treat the plant effluent.

Refuse disposal for April was 885.83 tons Industrial waste and 814.62 tons of rubbish and garbage.

Some months ago the cities of Menasha and Neenah authorized the Commission to engage a firm of Consulting Engineers to make a premiminary survey of the work necessary to comply with the State Board of Health order relative to secondary treatment of sewerage so as to relieve the B.O.D. demand on the river. Representative firms were contacted and they submitted written and oral proposals.

After considering all the factors involved, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that the Jerry Donohue Engineering Company of Sheboygan, Wisconsin be employed to conduct and make such survey of secondary Treatment at a cost of \$5,500.00 which menies have been requested and appropriated equally by the Cities of Neenah and Menasha to be used in payment for said professional Engineering services.

The Superintendent reported for the month of May 229.0 M.G. of sewage was treated at the plant. However due to the heavy rainfall and the high level of the lakes and river the pumpage was much greater, approximately 669.0 M.G. Also due to the high flow and clear water being pumped the solids retained at the plant was low.

A total of 1439.9 tons of refuse was burned at the plant during the month of May.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Also present, Attorney Crowley and Superintendent Sorensen.

The meeting was called to order by the President at 7:30 P.M.

The mimutes of the regular meeting of June 28, 1960 were read, approved and ordered placed on file.

On motion by Commissioner Liebhauser, seconded by Commissioner Hollenbeck, operating fund wouchers #421 thru #509 in the amount of \$16,846.64 were ordered paid. All voting aye.

On motion by Commissioner DenDooven, seconded by Commissioner Austin, the officers were authorized to sign a contract with The Jerry Donehue Engineering Company in the form approved by Attorney Crowley covering a preliminary survey of the work to be done in conformity with the order of the State Board of Health relative to installation of secondary treatment and such other additions to the plant as may be necessary in connection therewith. All voting aye.

The Superintendent reported that 179.8 M.G. of sewage were treated during the month of June. Solids averaged 14.8 tens per day. The flow was by-passed for a period of five consecutive days. While repairs were being made to the breeching. On several other accasions an excess of surface water in the sanitary sewers necessitated by-passing the flow. He reported that no by-passing was necessary in the first twenty-one days of July.

The Superintendent also reported that a total of 1409.6 tens of refuse was received at the plant with the incinerators operating a total of 241 hours.

He advised the Commission that considerable trouble has been experienced at the plant due to mischief, some occurrences approaching vandalism, particularly after playground hours. The trouble appears to stem from presence in the playground of people beyond the age for which the playground is intended. Toys and other material are being thrown into the settling tanks resulting at times in clogging the suction lines. Recently four large pieces of concrete were thrown into one of the settling tanks forcing the plant to shut down. This matter is to be taken up with the City Officals and the Playground Supervisor who accepted responsibility for the use of the grayads when they were made available as a play ground.

The Superintendent further reported that the Neenah intercepter had been cleaned from Union Street to the plant with no obstructions and very little silt being found. No materials were discovered that would have affected the flow through the sewer. Cleaning andinspection of the interceptor sewer from Third Street, Menasha to the plant is under way.

Commissioner Hollenbeck reported that negotiations which he and Attorney Crowley are conducting with representatives of the employees have disclosed no problems, and he expects to come to and understanding with them on a mutually satisfactory basis within the next thirty days.

Commissioner Liebhauser reported that he will supervise trials of an additive to the sewage as an acid to improving the operation of the filters. This additive has recently been put into use in some of the area paper mills with good results.

On motion by Commissioner Liebhauser, seconded by Commissioner Hollenbeck operating fund vouchers #510 thru #595 in the amount of \$13,513.43 were ordered paid. All voting aye.

The Superintendent reported a total of 291.4 M.G. of sewage was treated during the month of July. The metered flow averaged 10.79 M.G. per day. The flow was by-passed (4) days due to lack of incinerator fuel. A total of 1351.6 tons of refuse was received at the plant. Approximately 9,000 feet of interceptors were cleaned, from Third Street Menasha to Union Street Neenah. Very little silt was found on the Neenah side, the greatest accumulation was found from Third to Second Street in Menasha, some stones and concrete were found in this section. Number two sewage pump was overhauled completely and the pump is back in service.

The Superintendent was instructed to get the approval of the Commission's Attorney Crowley on the specifications for the wiring changes and to proceed with advertising for bids as soon as possible.

A letter from Harry Kind, Clerk of the City of Menasha inquiring if all Commission employees were residents of the two Cities was read and answered in the affirmative by the Commission's President Clifford.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Domestic rubbish and garbage amounted to 928.8 tons. Industrial refuse amounted to 830.3 tons. The increase in domestic refuse creates somewhat of a problem due to wet material, lawn clippings, brush and apples. More dry material to burn with domestic refuse would be desirable.

The Superintendent reported a total of 308.6 M.G. of sewage was treated during the month of September.

There was 788 tons of Industrial refuse and 879 tons of domestic garbage and rubbish was received and burned at the plant. Also 273.3 tons of dry sludge solids were burned.

A stainless steel screen was installed in the gas scrubber replacing the experimental one of mild steel which had proved successful in preventing charred bits of paper from being discharged from the chimney.

It became necessary to drain the south clarifier for the third time this summer due to an obstructed suction line. A set of horse shoes and stakes, tin cans and other debris was found in the intake.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Salary revisions for plant personel was discussed and referred to Commissioner Hollenbeck for further discussion with Union representatives and Attorney Crowley.

Moved by Commissioner DenDooven, seconded by Commissioner Liebhauser, that the Commission Attorney salary be increased to \$50.00 per month. All voting aye.

Moved by Commissioner Liebhauser, seconded by Commissioner DenDooven that retirement for Commission employees be set at age 65 unless at the Commission's discretion an extension be granted. All voting aye.

The Superintendent reported during the month of October, 1960 a total of 325.7 M.G. of sewage was treated at the plant. There were no days when sewage was by-passed. Dry solids retained amounted to 320.9 tons. Industrial refuse received amounted to 970.61 tons, domestic refuse and garbage amounted to 768.67 tons for a total of 1739.28 tons.

Sewage treated at the plant for the month of November, 1960 amounted to 335.3 M.G. Solids received averaged 16.6 tons per day. No sewage was by-passed except for about 5 hours due to power failure. A total of 1469.25 tons of mixed refuse was received and burned plus 233.0 tons of sewage solids burned.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
