He commended the Commission for implementation of the new accounting system which will be used after the new treatment plant is fully operational and the municipalities are charged on a usage basis. He stated that, until the new treatment plant is completed, the new accounting system will require careful monitoring by the Commission. Mr. Gerdener stated that a plant ledger be established and kept up-to-date using the physical inventory of fixed assets.

Moved by Commissioner Siebers, seconded by Commissioner Zelinski to accept the 1983 Financial Audit, as prepared by Schenck & Assoc., and place it on file with \$11,992.04 receivable from the City of Neenah and \$77,422.78 refunded to the City of Menasha. Voting aye; Commissioners Siebers, Haber, Bemke, LeCompte, Gross, Zelinski and Mulvey. Nays, none.

Commissioner Siebers recommended that Manager Windau be authorized to instruct the Accountant to keep-up the plant ledger.

Commissioner Siebers discussed the February 17, 1984 meeting with representatives from Blue Cross and NBC (National Benefit Consultants) and NMSC employees at which time mutual health insurance problems were discussed. Employee Bob Lennert stressed the fact that employees have bills from as far back as 5-6 months which haven't been paid and they are being forced to pay for them, themselves, or be faced with the bills being turned over to collection agencies. Commissioner Haber recommended that the NMSC pay any unpaid bills in two weeks if they aren't taken care of. Subject will be put on agenda for Regular Meeting on 3/13/84.

The following communications were discussed:

- 1. 2/20/84 letter to Mark Williams (DNR) from McMahon Assoc.; re: Wastewater Treatment Plant Design construction sequencing of the secondary treatment system and request to discharge primary treated effluent for a limited period of time.
- 2. Memo from FVWQPA; re: Suggestions on Alternatives To Be Presented To The Public For Wasteload Allocation Revisions For Clusters I and II.
- 3. 2/21/85 letter to Manager Windau from Menasha Corp.; re: Request to allow discharge of ink waste to be treated at Neenah-Menasha Treatment Plant. It was recommended that Manager Windau study the subject and report back to the Commission at their next meeting on 3/13/84.

Tom Vik (McMahon) gave a plant progress report. The plans and specs are still being reviewed by DNR with comments anticipated within a week or so. McMahon is investigating the issue of rennovating an existing fence or constructing a new one.

Commissioner Haber reported on the Broad Street Interceptor, allowing house laterals to hook directly into the interceptor rather than replacing local sanitary sewer. Moved by Commissioner Haber, seconded by Commissioner Bemke to approve the building of the interceptor down Broad Street eliminating the existing sanitary sewer and allowing house laterals on Broad Street to connect directly to the interceptor. All present voting aye; Nays, none. Motion carried. Notice to be sent to Ron Mueller (City of Menasha).

February 28, 1984 cont...

Commissioner Haber discussed the NMSC fence. Superintendent Schuelke stated that the existing fence requires constant maintenance. Tom Vik stated that they would complete their cost analysis of rehabilitating and maintaining the existing fence versus buying new fence.

Dave Wagner (McMahon) discussed the Sewer User Charge System. He stated that the study is required to obtain an EPA grant and is intended to meet their approval. The study describes the system of charges which will be required to construct, operate and maintain the new plant and interceptor (as well as the existing Commission interceptor). Mr. Wagner stated that Operation and Maintenance Charges are the only portion of the study subject to EPA approval. To these costs "Equipment replacement" costs must be added, per EPA guidelines. He also stated that Depreciation Charges are those charges required to provide adequate revenue to make the Commission's bonds marketable. Capital charges associated with the new facilities must be adequate to defray principal and interest on the Commission's bonds used to finance the new facilities. Moved by Commissioner Gross, seconded by Commissioner Siebers to authorize McMahon Associates to develop a final draft of the User Charge System and submit it to DNR and NMSC for review and approval. All present voting aye; Nays, none. Motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Siebers, seconded by Commissioner Gross to approve payment of \$144.35, for tuition, to Accountant Voigt. Voting aye; Commissioners Siebers, Haber, Bemke, LeCompte, Gross, Zelinski and Mulvey. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Manager Windau discussed the informational meeting, held on 2/23/84, on the Industrial Pretreatment Program. After DNR approval, a Public Hearing will be held to pass the Rules and Regulations.

Manager Windau discussed the Step III Engineering Contract. He stated that he and Attorney Goggin have gone over the contract and will discuss their comments with McMahon. They will report back to the Commission at the next meeting.

Manager Windau distributed copies of a Resolution of the Neenah-Menasha Sewerage Commission Relating To Final Cost Estimates For The Project Described Therein, as prepared by Ray Osness, (Clayton Brown). A meeting of the Budget, Finance and Personnel Committee will be held on 2/29/84 - 3:30 P.M. with Ray Osness.

Moved by Commissioner Haber, seconded by Commissioner Bemke to adjourn the meeting. All present voting aye; Nays, none. Meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.

The fast-track schedule starts the bidding process prior to DNR certification of our Step III Grant; but we risk spending about \$20,000 to \$30,000 on Step III Engineering services which would not be grant eligible due to the early start. Tom Probst recommended the fast-track schedule. Motion was made by Adam Haber and seconded by Frank Bemke to authorize the fast-track schedule. Motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote. Manager Windau will issue a press release drafted by McMahon regarding the fast-track schedule.

Motion was made by Adam Haber and seconded by Frank Bemke to authorize McMahon to begin preparation for a study of sludge storage facilities. Motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

Motion was made by Adam Haber and seconded by Frank Bemke to authorize McMahon to submit their response letter, dated March 27, 1984, to DNR's March 20, 1984 letter concerning review of plans and specifications. Motion carried unanimously.

Adam Haber stated that the Operations Committee decided to delay any action on the wasteload allocation issue until the Grand Chute/Menasha West Sewerage Commission met on April 5, 1984. The issue will be on the NMSC agenda for April 10.

Adam Haber stated that the Engineering Committee favors adopting the Step III Engineering Agreement.

Dale Siebers stated that the Personnel Committee is drafting a letter to the employees advising them that the present health insurance will be retained. but the health insurance will be evaluated this Fall.

Motion was made by Bob Gross and seconded by Bill Zelinski to authorize the proposed revisions to the accounting system as shown in Roger Voigt's March 20, 1984 budget revisions. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Adam Haber and seconded by Frank Bemke to approve the amended Step III Engineering Agreement with McMahon Associates, Inc. and authorize the signing of the Agreement by the officers. Motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

Dale Siebers reported on the discussion held with Fred Delie (Vertex) about computers. The treatment plant programmable controller should not be used to do accounting functions, but an accounting-type micro-processor should have the capability to receive data from the treatment plant computer. Motion was made by Dale Siebers and seconded by Frank Bemke to request McMahon to provide specifications for the programmable controller which can then be used to specify a micro-processor for compatibility and to assure linkage between the two computers. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Dale Siebers and seconded by Bob Gross to grant each salaried employee a 3% increase to his/her base salary effective January 1, 1984; and to grant each salaried employee an increase of \$460 to his/her base annual salary effective July 1, 1984. Motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

Motion was made by Bill Zelinski and seconded by Bob Gross that there be an additional \$700 progression to the accountant's annual salary effective January 1, 1984. Motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

- 1. It can be transferred to tanks by pumping.
- 2. Closed containers would not be subject to odors.

Manager Windau reported on a 3/30/84 letter from DNR notifying a change in sludge spreading requirements. Sludge shall not be spread closer than 1,000 feet to a residence during winter months when sludge cannot be incorporated into the soil. Manager Windau stated that the Town of Rosendale has banned the spreading of NMSC sludge for one year.

Wasteload Allocation was discussed. Commissioner Gross presented a letter to Grand Chute/Menasha West from Dave Carlson. The issue has been referred to the State Judicial Board. GC/MW will meet on April 19, 1984 - 6:30 P.M. to further discuss the issue. Moved by Commissioner Haber, seconded by Commissioner Bemke that the Wasteload Allocation issue be tabled until action is taken by GC/MW. All present voting aye; Nays, none. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on Budget, Finance & Personnel Committee meetings of May 30, 1984 and June 5, 1984. The following subjects were discussed:

1. Additional funds needed for Step 2.

Accountant Voigt estimates that the NMSC will be \$50,000 - \$60,000 short on Step II Project Costs; an estimated \$10,000 to cover legal fees, etc. and \$45,000 for design of the sludge storage facility. It was suggested that the payment of the \$45,000 bill (when received), could be delayed until the Project BAN's are issued. Other costs of smaller amounts could be paid from funds temporarily borrowed from the O&M Fund. Such a loan from the O&M Fund would be paid back upon issuance of the Project BAN.

2. Interest earned on Town of Neenah's prepayment.

Committee stated that the prepayment and interest earned now belongs to the NMSC and the interest would not be used solely to cover Town of Neenah's share of costs.

3. Segregation of Step II interceptor costs.

It was the consensus of the committee that the entire balance of the Step II debt following receipt of the Step II grant, be incorporated into Step III BAN including any 1984 Capital Budget expenditures. Each contracting user will be reimbursed any capital payments made in 1984 from money raised in the issuance of Project BAN. Any inequities in cost splits between contracting users for payments on the Step II treatment plant costs versus interceptor costs will be erased and new equitable cost splits will be established and all contracting users will begin debt payment from a base of zero.

4. Basis of Capital Cost Splits and System For Comparing Capital Payments based on actual use versus prepayments. Draft Resolutions were prepared by Manager Windau and will be discussed at a later date.

Tom Probst (McMahon) presented a Project Progress Report. He stated that the response to the advertisement for bids has been good. June 13, 1984 is the supplier deadline for prequalification statements. Work is still being done on the grants along with the acquisition of easements along the interceptor route. The Bid Opening Date has been extended to June 27, 1984.

Discussion was held on the 6/1/84 letter to Manager Windau from John Hario (DNR) and 6/7/84 reply from Tom Vik (McMahon).

- 1. DNR stated that the installation and procurement of carpets are not grant eligible. Vik stated that the funding agency should consider funding the difference between carpeting cost and another suitable grant eligible floor finish.
- 2. DNR stated that the fifth screw pump to be installed in the headworks building apparently is not necessary for operation for the 20-year design life of the treatment works but is for future expansion. Therefore, it is not grant eligible. Vik stated that space should be allowed for the fifth pump and this space should be grant eligible.
- 3. DNR stated that the observation platform is not grant eligible. Vik stated that observation deck is the only place one can observe the operation of all the screw pumps at the same time and should be grant eligible.

- 4. DNR stated that demolition, of some manholes not necessary to accomplish the eligible construction, is not grant eligible. Vik stated that complete abandonment of certain manholes should be grant eligible. Field inspection of these manholes has shown them to be in a badly deteriorated condition which could cause problems to nearby structures or roads which are grant eligible. The cost to abandon the manholes during construction of the interceptor will be much less than to repair the damage caused at a later date.
- 5. DNR stated that unallowable costs include the cost of furnishings. Vik stated that office furnishings as specified in Division 12, can be readily broken out of the contract after bidding.
- 6. DNR stated that the weed trimmer, snowblower, high pressure cleaner and sludge loader are not grant eligible. Vik stated that the weed trimmer, snow blower and high pressure cleaner have been deleted from the project in Addendum 1. However, the sludge loader is solely intended for use specifically for the sludge management program and should be grant eligible.
- 7. DNR stated that the flagpole and plaque are not grant eligible. Vik concurred.

Discussion was held on 6/4/84 letter to McMahon Associates, Inc. from Vertex confirming their interest in bidding on the Instrumentation and Controls portion of the Neenah-Menasha Regional Wastewater Facilities. Moved by Commissioner Bemke, seconded by Commissioner Haber to allow Vertex to bid on the Instrumentation and Controls portion of the Neenah-Menasha Regional Wastewater Facilities subject to approval by the Commission Counsel. - 2. Frank Whiting (Geo. Whiting Paper Co.) 4.02B Sampling Charges. Whitings take a 24 hour compositie sample out of their own sampler vs grab sample by the Commission. Should the charges be the same? Manager Windau stated that Whiting Paper is obligated to pay sufficient fees to cover the new program. However, the metering equipment cost could be excused due to Whiting's using their own equipment, but they must pay the administrative fee of \$225.
- 3. Jim Schmidt (U.S. Paper Mills) Kinds and frequency of samples. Manager Windau stated that samples would be taken two to four times a year. They would not be tested for SS or BOD but other pollutants.

Mr. Schmidt was also concerned about the broadness of the wording in 3.01c because water has corrosive properties and he was concerned about the generalization of things in 3.01e which could refer to hydrogen sulfide. Manager Windau stated that the way these items are handled will depend on how they are viewed by the Commission and what they consider to be problems. With the language the way it is, it is not the Commission's intent to take action on every little thing.

- 4. Frank Whiting (Whiting Paper Co.) 3.01H Objectionable Color. Is color now used by Whiting Paper Co. considered objectionable? Manager Windau answered no.
- 5. Dave Bredendick (Eggers Industries)
  The current NR101 report contains definitions which could be parallel
  to the Wastewater Discharge Permit. Is it the intention of the Commission
  to perform duplicate surveys contained in NR101? Manager Windau stated
  that sampling done could suffice for NR101.
